Welcome back after a lovely Easter break. We hope you have had an enjoyable and relaxing time. It is undoubtedly going to be another fabulous and fascinating term as we are exploring our new enquiry question 'Does the world need rainforests?' . We will be exploring features of rainforests around the world, thinking about;

Which plants and animals live in the rainforest? How many different species are there? What are the different layers of the rainforest? Where in the world are rainforests found? What are the threats to rainforests? Do people live in the rainforest?

To start off our rainforest topic we will be having our experience day on Wednesday 24th April 2019 (text message sent out last term).
