

### Reading with your child

As you will be aware, we place a large importance on reading here at Red Oaks. Listening to your child read as part of their weekly homework is a vital part of this. Whilst we know this can be difficult to squeeze in, especially as a working parent, the benefits of it are lifelong. Remember, reading is not just about 'reading words.' When we read, we are: increasing our vocabulary; building greater empathy; developing a positive attitude towards reading; building our knowledge of the word around us; making predictions and drawing conclusions. As you can see from the information below, reading can make such a change to a child's vocabulary!
