Car Park Reminders

Please can we remind all parents that the car park speed limit is 4mph and that there are plenty of parent car parking spaces. Children

You must make sure that any children in the vehicle you're driving are:

- in the <u>correct car seat</u> for their height or weight until they reach 135 centimetres tall or their 12th birthday, whichever is first
- wearing a seat belt if they're 12 or 13 years old, or younger and over 135cm tall


We hope to be able to display all the photographs in school.

Top Tips for taking a great photograph:

- * Pause to focus and hold the camera still to avoid blurring
- * Experiment with angles
- * Don't take a shot directly into the light as this will make objects or people look dark.
- * Don't be afraid to zoom and take close up shots
- * Take lots of pictures you can always delete the ones you don't want
- * Use appropriate creative effects to enhance your photograph.
- * Place the object of interest at the centre of the shot.
- * Stock images are generally easy to identify and will not be judged
