

TPAT Historical Fiction Competition

Are you ready to bring the past to life?

Write your own piece of historical fiction. You can set your story in **ANY** time period or place across the world in the past, so long

as it links to a period in history. Your story can be based on a real-life event or a fictional event but set in an accurate and real historical context.

Suggested themes: Race, Diversity, Celebration, Remembrance, Conflict

Suggested time periods: Ancient Egypt, Ancient Rome, Vikings, Saxons, Tudors, Victorians, 20th century (WWI, WWII)

What are the judges looking for?

- **Historical accuracy** even down to the choice of names characters are given and any props additional to the historical setting. Research is key!
- A riveting read with a good plot!
- A convincing story For example, is it plausible that these events and/or this character could have existed at the time?
- Use of historical knowledge to feed the plot, context and character
- Effective use of historical vocabulary and literary conventions, including where dialogue is included in the story
- Creative and interesting perspectives of storytelling.
- Story length should be between **400-3,500** words.
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- House points for all entries.
- A prize for the winner in each year group.
